MORNING MIST PROPERTY

you ever Have been stopped for a train crossing Clintonville Road? If you happen to be traveling east toward North Branford, look to your right just before the railroad crossing and you have found the Morning Mist Property. Access to this 3.75 acre property is a narrow band located between the water company station and Mike's Automotive.

In recent years, a path was blazed through the property, some bird houses and nesting balls were put in place, and a sign was placed at the entrance. A recent tour of the site by Land Trust board members found evidence of many birds still visiting as well as deer tracks.

Other than the small improvements, the property has been left to nature, and along with that comes the

risk and evidence of invasive plants.

EARTH DAY AT NORTH HAVEN MIDDLE SCHOOL

The North Haven Land Trust was one of several organizations that celebrated Earth Day on Saturday, April 13. Officially Earth Day is April 22, this year falling on a Monday, but cities and towns across the country and around the world often choose another day around this date for their own celebrations. While it is a global celebration of our planet, each town may focus on issues and activities of a more local nature.

The North Haven Conservation
Commission is the local sponsor
for this event and coordinated
all the activities of the day.
These included a scavenger
hunt, recycling games, and projects and posters created by
North Haven School students.
Students from Ridge Road
School created colorful fish from
recycled water bottles and students from Clintonville School
put on a skit promoting recycling

of paper in the classroom.

Home Depot sponsored some hands on projects providing an opportunity for kids to build birdhouses and wooden cars, as well as planting some flower and vegetable seeds.

In all, there were over thirty organizations exhibiting information about their roles in the community and their efforts to be good stewards of the land.

LAND TRUST MEMBERSHIP

For many years our investments

The North Haven Land Trust is a non-profit corporation dedicated to acquiring and preserving open space in our town. The NHLT accepts donations of land, conservation easements or money to purchase land.

The more than 125 land trusts in Connecticut have acquired and preserved more than 22,000 acres of land. Through the Connecticut Land Conservation Council the NHLT works closely with The Nature Conservancy and other environmental organizations. It is independent of town government but cooperates with the North Haven Conservation Commission and town officials to achieve common goals. The Board of Directors, officers and members are your neighbors who have joined together to save some of our streams, ponds, woodlands and marshes.
